Faculty can submit an application for an engagement activity by logging into The COMPASS: <https://middlesex.collegiatelink.net/form/start/47918>. Submission requires faculty to log into The COMPASS with their MCC email credentials (if they already have an account). Faculty who do not have a COMPASS account will be asked to create an account (using their MCC email credentials). Applications should be submitted at least three (3) weeks prior to the activity date.
