- CRJ 112 is a prerequisite for CRJ 152.
- Students can choose any course as a Free Elective including any CRJ course.
- Students who plan to enroll in CRJ 241 as a CRJ elective must complete the prerequisite for this course, CRJ 152.
- Students are advised to take CRJ 151 after completing at least one other CRJ course, preferably CRJ 111, and not to postpone enrolling in it until the last semester.
