Career and Transfer Outlook

- Typically, graduates find employment in private and group dental practices. There is a high demand for qualified and credentialed dental assistants.
- Upon successful completion of the certificate program, graduates are eligible to be licensed in Massachusetts as a registered Dental Assistant, and are eligible to sit for the Dental Assisting National Board exam which awards the credential of Certified Dental Assistant.
