## General Advising Notes

- FPS 100 is the pre-requisite for all FPS courses.
- Completion of modules 1-8 or eligibility for MAT 080 is the prerequisite for SCI 110 – Chemistry and Physics for the Fire Service and FPS 151 – Fire Science Hydraulics.
- Students are encouraged to take Math in their first semester to allow time for completion of the Math sequence.
- Students are advised to enroll in GOV 120 American Government before FPS 203 – Law and Fire Service.
- SCI 110 should be taken before FPS 150 Hazardous Materials.
- Humanities are courses with the following prefixes: ART, COM, DAN, ENG, ETH, HUM, LAN, MUS, PHL, REL, THE.
- Students can choose any course as a Free Elective. EMT 100 Emergency Medical Technician (9 credits) is recommended and will fulfill both free elective requirements.
- Training and courses taken at the Massachusetts Fire Academy, the military or from working on the job may be beneficial toward receiving prior life experience credits towards the degree.
