General Advising Notes

- ENG 101 and EDU 122 (formerly PSY 122) are the pre-requisites for most EDU courses.
- Students are encouraged to take Math in their first semester to allow time for completion of the Math sequence.
- IDS 101 should be taken within students first 30 credits.
- EDU 104 and IDS 122 must be taken together; EDU 153 and IDS 123 must be taken together.
- EDU 101 and EDU 153 are the pre-requisites for the program capstone, EDU 251. Students must be in good academic standing and obtain permission from the Department before registering. EDU 251 should be taken in students' last semester before graduating.
- The following courses may be taken as EDU electives: EDU 100; EDU 102; EDU 103; EDU 110; EDU 150; EDU 154 or EDU 252.
- Humanities Electives are courses with the following prefixes: ART, COM, DAN, ENG, ETH, HUM, LAN, MUS, PHL, REL and THE.
- SCI 121 is only offered in the fall; SCI 122 is only offered in the spring. These two courses do not need to be taken in sequence.
