


Want to focus a department or division meeting around improving students' communication skills?

FAQs: **What are some of the things that a coach can do with faculty at a department or division meeting?** Coaches will attend your meeting and provide you with an overview of the many services they can offer, and/or they can come and work with you on a specific project, e.g.:

- Developing rubrics that are appropriate to students' written and numerical skills
- Developing exam questions and assignments that elicit the information you are looking for
- Embedding student use of the Writing Center and/or tutoring for draft revision as a required assignment component
- Integrating essential information literacy skills into short and long-term assignments
- Developing effective PowerPoint assignments (including oral presentation skills)
- Teaching students how to read and analyze data in multiple formats (*Numeracy coach will teach this in your class*)

Do the coaches get paid for their work? Yes, faculty coaches are paid stipends for their work. Professional staff coaches are not able to receive stipends, but they still want to help!
