



Articulation Agreement

College of Professional and Continuing Education (CPCE) at Wentworth Institute of Technology and Middlesex Community College (MCC) agree to enter into an articulation agreement as outlined below, for students from the programs of MCC listed below to enter the Bachelor of Science in Project Management (**BPM-Hybrid**) of CPCE:

- Associate in Science - Business Administration Transfer
- Associate in Science - Engineering Science Transfer
- Associate in Science in Liberal Studies – Information Technology Transfer Concentration
- Associate in Science in Business Administration - Accounting

Terms of articulation agreement

Students who have been enrolled in, but may or may not have completed the Associate Degree in the above programs at MCC, can be accepted into our Project Management bachelor's degree program. CPCE will offer a 20% discount on the prevailing tuition rate for each semester to MCC transfer students. In order to be eligible for this tuition discount, students must remain within their assigned cohort and are expected to take their core courses at the MCC main campus in Bedford, MA.

General Terms:

1. The agreement is valid only for the Bachelor's degree program in Project Management (BPM) offered through CPCE.
2. Students are expected to enter the program in the fall or spring semesters as a cohort, as determined by CPCE. A minimum of 15 students and a maximum of 25 students are expected to be within each cohort.
3. All major classes (48 credits to include the capstone) are expected to be held at the MCC campus as agreed to by the parties.
4. Students will be enrolled and treated as CPCE students at WIT during the course of their studies in the BPM program of CPCE.
5. Application and registration are to be completed on-line.
6. MCC agrees to collaborate in marketing the program to their alumni.
7. CPCE will be responsible for all marketing and recruiting costs authorized and contracted for by CPCE, to promote this program.
8. Students must have a GPA of 2.5 or better at MCC.
9. Only grades of 'C' or better will be accepted for transfer.
10. No credit will be transferred for course work done by a student that is more than ten years old as of the date of application to WIT.
11. The articulation agreement will be valid for a period of three years from the effective date, and will be considered for renewal by both institutions at the end of that period.

12. Faculty will be provided and compensated by CPCE.
13. CPCE's Curriculum Advisory Board will review Humanities and Social Science courses from MCC for possible upper level credit. Currently students entering WIT under other articulation agreements must meet 3 upper level Humanities and 6 upper level Social Science credits. MCC will submit the syllabi from selected courses to CPCE for review; CPCE's Curriculum Advisory Board will either:
 - a. Elect to transfer these courses to meet upper level credits, or
 - b. Suggest to MCC revisions in the curriculum for selected courses in order for the course(s) to meet the upper level credit requirements at CPCE.
14. In order to fulfill CPCE graduation requirements the following curricular conditions must be met:
Curricular Terms
 - Students are required to take a minimum of 48 credits through CPCE; all these credits must be in the major.
 - In addition to these 48-credits in the major in Project Management, students must meet the General Education requirements by program
 - Students can transfer up to 80 credits, however, the number of transfer credits in the Humanities and Social Sciences cannot exceed:
 - 3 Credits of lower-level Humanities; 3 credits of upper-level Humanities
 - 3 Credits of lower-level Social Science; and 6 credits of upper-level Social Science (upper-level must meet the definition for upper level as defined in the WIT catalogue).
15. CPCE is to be notified at least one full year in advance of any changes to the course content, course requirements or credits assigned to courses in the programs listed above from MCC. Upon such notice, CPCE will decide what transfer credit will be given, if any, for the changes, and will amend the understanding of the credits that will be accepted for transfer accordingly.
16. When CPCE plans changes to the requirements for the BPM program, it will notify MCC with reasonable notice so that MCC's students may plan to satisfy those additional requirements. Any student accepted into the CPCE's BPM program will be required to satisfactorily complete any new requirements of the program.
17. CPCE and MCC agree to cooperate in communicating with each other and with their common and respective public, concerning the established relationship between the two institutions. Communication may include the development of various kinds of publications to inform those who might benefit from the opportunities provided by this agreement. Faculty and staff associated with these programs will be encouraged to make their students aware of this agreement, including referencing this agreement on MCC and WIT's websites, and other including reference to this agreement in their related marketing materials.
